Who are People First?

People First has been supporting people across the North of England for over 30 years.

Our work is built upon the foundational belief that each and every individual is treated equally and fairly. We strive to make this a reality by supporting people to have their views heard and their rights respected so that they can live their lives the way they choose.

In Lancashire, we have the privilege of facilitating the Lancashire Learning Disability Peer Advocacy Network, and supporting the Learning Disability Partnership Board.

The Peer Advocacy Network, established by Lancashire County Council, brings people with a learning disability together with a shared purpose: to live their lives the way they choose, uninhibited by societal limitations or misconceptions.

We do this in many ways, including empowering members to speak up and to advocate for themselves and their peers.

Members of the Network, empower one another to be creative and determined to achieve their aspirations, as well as challenging inequality and injustice when they see it.

The Network gives opportunities for collaborative work to ensure people with a learning disability get better access to health and social care, housing or employment. It champions the rights of people to develop friendships, relationships and to be heard and seen as valued members of communities.

Building upon individual and collective experiences, the Network has the confidence and insight to help shape current and future services and systems. It is not solely focused on empowering its members, the Network aims to achieve societal change across the county. Change where communities, businesses and industries do not discriminate or exclude people with a learning disability from the same opportunities available to others.
